

SOCPR Guiding Principles

- Children have access to a comprehensive array of services.
- Services are individualized.
- Services are received within the least restrictive environment.
- Families are included as full participants in service planning and delivery.
- Services are integrated and coordinated.
- Case management is provided to ensure effective service coordination and system navigation.
- The system promotes early identification and intervention.
- Children with SED are ensured a smooth transition to adult services when they reach maturity.
- The rights of children with SED are protected.
- Children receive service regardless of race, religion, national origin, sex or other characteristics.

System of Care Practice Review in Ontario: Training Opportunities

Purpose of the SOCPR

The SOCPR is a tool for assessing whether system of care principles are operationalized at the level of practice, where children and their families have direct contact to service providers. The SOCPR collects and analyzes data obtained from multiple sources to determine adherence to system of care values and principles.

System of Care (SOC) Values

1. Child Centered and Family Focused
2. Community Based
3. Culturally Competent

Agency Applications

- Used to evaluate the fidelity of practice to the system of care principles.
- Documents the experience of the child and family within the agency/program.
- Quality assurance and improvement measure.
- Identifies staff training needs.

System Applications

- Identification of strengths as well as areas that need improvement.
- Provides decision makers with valuable information for system enhancements.
- Identifies system training needs.
